As project manager and IT liaison at Antioch New England Graduate School, Caleb John Clark ([www.plocktau.com](http://www.plocktau.com)) gets to do what he does best in the kind of environment in which he thrives the most, an academic setting. He has a strong track record of building positive human relationships to the use of technology through education. Throughout his career as a project manager and teacher, and his activities as a writer and community builder, Caleb has been a successful advocate for the best possible human future through an understanding and synergy of people and their high-tech tools and toys.

Caleb co-founded the NoEnd Web Developer's group (for which he was recognized by *Wired Magazine*) as a webmaster in the Bay Area during the acceleration of the dotcom boom in the mid-1990s, a group which to this day shares professionalism and tools of the trade in an online and in-person environment that is often considered a model for building and maintaining community of any kind. He has worked as a project manager, research assistant and instructional media lab technician, and has provided technical instruction and support to students and faculty from high school to graduate school levels.

Caleb project managed the products testing lab for the new and cutting edge San Diego Padres ballpark in 2000-2001. He has also been a regular contributor to *Wired* and has written for or been interviewed or featured in numerous books, magazines and online publications from *Omni* to *Salon.com*.

He has worked or partnered with numerous startups such as Maxis, now owned by Electronic Arts, and technology heavy-weights such as Cisco, Oracle, Logitech and Syquest. He has been effective in various roles including instructional designer, production manager, network manager, multimedia web developer, research assistant and video production assistant. He has served as an online community moderator for Netscape and served on significant panels regarding online community development.

Caleb obtained an MA in Educational Technology at San Diego State in 1999 (and was awarded Outstanding Student of the Year in 2000), and a BA with emphasis in film and video production at Arizona State University in 1991.
